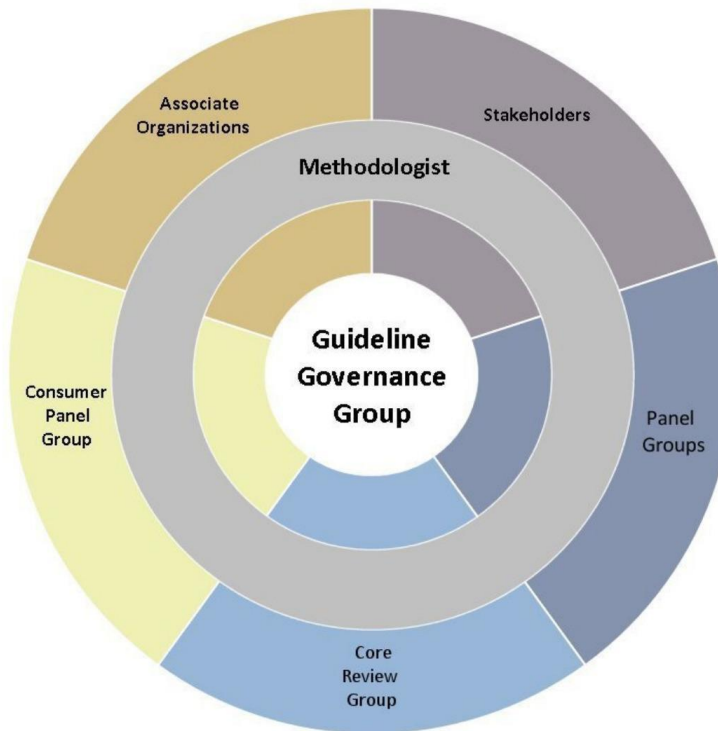

Panel Group members

- Apply directly to Member and Associate Organizations and represent that organization
- Subject matter experts: clinicians, educators and researchers (no industry representatives)
- Must complete a Conflict of Interest statement at the beginning and end of project
- Participate in Panel Group topics based on clinical areas covered by the Guideline
- Panel Groups include experts from a range of expert backgrounds and geographic regions



What do I need to be involved?

- Proficient in English - reading, writing and speaking
- Expert knowledge of pressure ulcers/injuries
- Interest and expertise in specific PU/PI-related topics (e.g. support surfaces, wound assessment, etc.)
- Some knowledge of guideline processes
- Able to use internet, email and web-conference (camera, microphone)
- Able to respond promptly
